Some opening remarks where made by representatives from Brakspear, and Standing Orders were suspended for members of the public to give their opinions and concerns about the applications. A lengthy discussion ensued between residents and the representatives, with concerns raised about parking, ventilation, the proposed bi-fold doors amongst other items.

Planning:

a) New applications to be considered since the last meeting by the PC with comments to be submitted to Buckinghamshire Council planning portal:

<u>23/06069/FUL – The Bull And Butcher Turville Valley Road Turville</u> – Demolition of existing outbuilding and kitchen wash up area and erection of single storey rear extension, single storey dining room extension and single storey function room extension together with internal alterations

<u>23/06070/LBC – The Bull And Butcher Turville Valley Road Turville</u> – Listed building application for demolition of existing outbuilding and kitchen wash up area and erection of single storey rear extension, single storey dining room extension and single storey function room extension together with internal alterations

Same comments to be submitted for both applications:

On balance the Parish Council, object to these applications. Whilst the Parish Council and the residents of Turville fully support the plans to renovate the kitchen, we feel the underused existing areas of the pub could be better utilised. The additional footprint proposed we feel will cause considerable issues with parking in the village. There is no capacity to extend the car park, meaning the overflow will spill out into the already congested area impacting on residents in the village.

We object to the proposed bifold doors, and feel that they are not inkeeping with the Turville Conservation Area and the listed status of the core of the village and the pub itself. Also, the proposed large glass doors would increase the transmission of interior noise to the village properties, many of which are listed and therefore have no option of double glazing.

The PC would welcome and be supportive of an application that would update the kitchen and "tidy up" the general look of the pub, which is sensitive to the Conservation Area and without an increased footprint of the building.
